Introduction

As the EU prepares its next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF), urgent questions arise about how public budgets reflect our values. Despite binding commitments to gender equality and inclusive governance, the EU's budgetary processes remain far from being gender responsive. Increased militarization of EU budgets threatens to crowd out social spending and further marginalize the gender equality agenda. It's time to reaffirm a rights-based fiscal approach and ensure that gender responsive budgeting (GRB) is not sidelined but at the centre of its planning, formulation and execution.

- contributing to building solid foundations for the next EU budget (MFF 2028-2034) to promote gender equality, women's rights, peace and social investments

- fostering inclusive cooperation with civil society and global partners to effectively contribute to the negotiation process

Conference venue



On the 26th and 27th March the conference will take place at the University of Cyprus which is located in Panepistimiou Avenue 2109 Aglantzia Nicosia Cyprus, and is around 8 km from the city centre. A shuttle bus will be available to take participants there in the morning and bring them back in the afternoon. There are also busses that run from the University to Solomou Square which is in the center of Nicosia.

Hotel accommodation

Because of the EU Presidency, most of the hotels fill up very quickly. If you intend to participate at the conference please make your reservation the soonest. If you need help please let us know

Transport from Larnaka airport to Nicosia

Please make sure that you arrive at the Larnaka airport (40 minutes from Nicosia) or Pafos airport (1 ½ hour from Nicosia)

From the airports you can come to Nicosia either by taxi or by shuttle bus.

Taxis

- Taxi from Larkana to Nicosia 55 euro
- Taxi from Pafos to Nicosia 135 euro during the day

Shuttle bus

Shuttle bus from Larkana to Nicosia (aprox 40 minutes) adults 9 euro .

Please note that the terminal of the shuttle bus from the airport to Nicosia is at the outskirts of Nicosia. From there you need to take a taxi to bring you to the hotel. Taxis have to be reserved in advance so that they can wait for you at the terminal. The taxi from the terminal to the hotel is 10 euro.
